In an attempt to reduce paper use, the system we are using is completely online. This new system is called Class Dojo and has been tested by 5A. You can do this using the iOS and Android app, for your smart phone and tablet, or you can log in as a parent at <https://www.classdojo.com/>. Once we have received this we can then add your child to the class during our next Computing lesson.


Year 1 went on a minibeast hunt. Students searched for minibeasts that can be found around the playground and used magnifying glasses to observe them.

Whole School Behaviour Policy

Our Whole School Behaviour Policy is an important way we communicate to you about your child's behaviour. If your child does come home with a red card, it is important that you sit down with them and discuss what was wrong with their behaviour and help them to understand how to avoid behaving in this way again. Schools which succeed in achieving and maintaining high standards of behaviour and discipline tend to be those with the best relationships with parents. Children will co-operate with the code of behaviour fully when parents and teachers work together to implement the code.

You can support the plan by the following methods:

- Ensure your child attends school regularly as per the school calendar year.
- Encourage your child to do their best and to take responsibility for their work.
- Be aware of and cooperate with the school's rules and system of rewards and sanctions.
- Attend meetings at the school if requested.
- Help their children with homework and ensure that it is completed.
